17	SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY	
18	A. The Health, Education and Human Services Committee is a standing committee of the	
19	Navajo Nation Council and serves as the oversight committee for the Division of Social	
20	Services. 2 N.N.C. § 400(A).	
21	B. The Navajo Nation established the Naabik'íyáti' Committee as a Navajo Nation Council	
22	standing committee 2 N.N.C. § 700 (A). Proposed legislations that are assigned to the	
23	Navajo Nation Council as final authority shall be assigned to the Naabik'íyáti'	
24	Committee for review and consideration. 2 N.N.C. § 164 (A)	
25	C. The Navajo Nation Council is the governing body of the Navajo Nation. 2 N.N.C. §

28	SECTION TWO. FINDINGS	
29	A. The Division of Social Services (the "Division") is established under the Executive	
30	Branch of the Navajo Nation Government. 2 N.N.C. § 1651.	

- B. Public Law 102-477 is the Indian Employment, Training and Related Services Demonstration Act, which was passed in 1992 and amended in 2000.
- C. The goal of the law is to reduce unemployment through workforce development and job training in tribal communities by reducing and streamlining administrative requirements. Each participating tribe decides which eligible employment and training related federal programs to include in its 477 plan.
- D. Public Law 102-477 applies to any federal formula-funded program intended for employment, training, and services that may enhance a person's ability to become self-reliant.
- E. For each tribe and tribal organizations with active 477 plans, the BIA conducts on-site monitoring at least once every three years and, in coordination with affected agencies, provides technical assistance related to audit findings or program activities. BIA will notify affected agencies of the on-site monitoring activities. Affected federal partners are invited to participate and notify the BIA of any issues or concerns so that they can be addressed during the on-site review. BIA also conducts annual 477 Program trainings at regional and national conferences for participating and non-participating tribes. https://www.doi.gov/ocl/tribal-477-programs.
- F. Twelve United States Executive Branch Departments have entered into a Memorandum of Agreement ("MOA") for the submission, review, and approval of 477 Plans. This MOA requires the 477 Plan to be approved by the governing body of the tribe.
- G. The Division has submitted its 477 Plan which is attached as Exhibit A.
- H. The Department of Justice reviewed the 477 Plan submitted by the Division and determined it to be legally sufficient. The Department of Justice's review documents are attached as **Exhibit B**.

## SECTION THREE. APPROVAL

The Navajo Nation hereby approves the 477 Plan, as detailed in Exhibit A, prepared by the Division of Social Services.
