PURPOSE: The purpose of this proposed resolution is to approve free fishing for honorably discharged Navajo veterans.

19	SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY	
20	A. The Health, Education, and Human Services Committee is a standing committee of the	
21	Navajo Nation Council. 2 N.N.C. § 400(A). Among other powers, the Committee shall	
22	review and recommend resolutions relating to social services, health, environmental	
23	health, education, veterans and veterans services, employment and labor. 2 N.N.C. §	
24	401(B)(6).	
25	B. The Resources and Development Committee is a standing committee of the Navajo	
26	Nation Council and serves as the oversight committee for the Division of Natural	
27	Resources with authority to promulgate rules and regulations governing the use, sale,	
28	exchange and development of Navajo Nation lands and/or resources. 2 N.N.C. §§	
29	500(A), 501(B)(1), 501 (C)(1).

C. The Resources and Development Committee has the authority to establish fees and regulations for hunting and fishing activities. 17 N.N.C. § 512.

SECTION TWO. FINDINGS

- A. The Department of Fish and Wildlife is established within the Division of Natural Resources. RDCO-79-16 at Exhibit K Plan of Operation Department of Fish and Wildlife Division of Natural Resources at page 1.
- B. The Department currently operates under the Navajo Nation Fishing and Boating Regulations as approved by RCS-166-91 and attached as **Exhibit A**.
- C. Fishing permits are required for the taking of fish from Navajo waters. 17 N.N.C § 501 and Navajo Nation Fishing and Boating Regulations § 2.02.
- D. The Navajo Nation Fishing and Boating Regulations contains the following provision:2.02 Permits Requirements
 - A. Any person, Navajo or Non-Navajo twelve (12) years of age and over who angles, or fishes for aquatic wildlife in Navajo waters must have in their possession a proper and valid fishing permit.
 - B. Persons under twelve (12) years of age are not required to have such a permit, but are only entitled to one-half the daily bag and possession limits. Persons under twelve (12) years of age may purchase a proper permit and be entitled to the full daily bag and possession limits.
 - C. Any Navajo Tribal Member sixty (60) years of age and over is entitled to a lifetime fishing permit. This permit will be issued only at the Navajo Fish and Wildlife Office in Window Rock, Arizona.
 - D. A Commercial Waterdog Permit is required to take, possess, purchase, sell, or transport waterdogs for commercial purposes on the Navajo Nation.

E. Those qualified for a group fishing permit include, but are not limited to schools, youth groups, senior citizens groups, special education groups and other non-profit organizations. Eligibility, fees and dates for group fishing permits will be decided on an individual basis by the Director of the Navajo Fish and Wildlife Department. Group fishing permits can only be received by contacting the Director of the Navajo Fish and Wildlife Department.

In lieu of a fee, the group can provide an in-kind service, such as picking up litter at an area lake, before fishing. If the Director approves, the in-kind service will serve as the fee for receiving the group permit.

- E. The Navajo Nation Office of the President and Vice President, on behalf of Navajo veterans, requests that honorably discharged Navajo veterans be entitled to lifetime fishing permits at no cost.
- F. This request is supported by the Navajo Nation Department of Fish and Wildlife and various Navajo veteran organizations. OPVP requests and supporting documents are attached as **Exhibit B**.
- G. It is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation to provide lifetime fishing permits to honorably discharged Navajo veterans at no cost.

SECTION THREE. APPROVAL

A. The Navajo Nation hereby amends the Navajo Nation Fishing and Boating Regulations, by the addition of a new paragraph C with the following language to § 2.02:

C. Any Navajo veteran who has been honorably discharged from United States military service shall be entitled to a lifetime fishing permit at no cost upon proof of enrollment with the Navajo Nation and valid proof of honorable
