A. Pursuant to Committee Resolution RDCF-16-18, the Resources and Development Committee approved the Black Mesa Chapter's Community-Based Land Use Plan in 2018.

present and projected or required community facilities including, but not limited

to, recreation areas, schools, libraries, and other public buildings. It will also
