TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACTION RELATING TO RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE; APPROVING THE NAVAJO NATION CLEAN AIR ACT MINOR SOURCE PROGRAM REGULATIONS

PURPOSE: The purpose of this legislation is to approve the Navajo Nation Clean Air Act Minor Source Program Regulations, which will establish a permitting program for minor sources of air pollution located on the Navajo Nation.

16	SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY	
17	A. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council has	
18	oversight over environmental protection "to oversee regulation of activities on	
19	Navajo Nation lands for disposition or acquisition of resources, surface	
20	disturbance, or alteration of the natural state of the resource, including the	
21	enforcement and administration of applicable Navajo Nation and federal laws,	
22	regulations, guidelines, and administrative procedures in the development and use	
23	of resources as a good steward." 2 N.N.C. § 500(C); 500(C)(2).	
24	B. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council has	
25	the authority to "promulgate rules and regulations governing transportation,	
26	community development, local government units, land acquisitions for the Navajo	
27	Nation, environmental protection, and the use, sale, exchange, and development	
28	of Navajo Nation lands and/or resources, whether held in fee or in trust status. 2	
29	N.N.C. § 501(B)(1).

## **SECTION TWO. FINDINGS**

- A. The Navajo Nation Environmental Protection Agency (or "Navajo EPA") was established, among other things, to "protect the public health and the environment of the Navajo Nation through legislative proposals, monitoring and data collection, [and] rule making as may be authorized by the Navajo Nation Council, enforcement actions, public education, obtaining funding, and other appropriate means." 2 N.N.C. § 1922(B).
- B. The Navajo Nation Clean Air Act was approved by the Navajo Nation Council in order to create a coordinated program to control present and future sources of air pollution on the Navajo Nation, along with providing for the regulation of air pollution activities in a manner that ensures the health, safety and general welfare of all the residents of the Navajo Nation, protecting property values and protecting plant and animal life, among other purposes. 4 N.N.C. § 1102(A)(2).
- C. Pursuant to the Navajo Nation Clean Air Act, including 4 N.N.C. §§ 1103, 1112(A)(1)(c), and 1134(G), Navajo EPA has developed the Navajo Nation Clean Air Act Minor Source Program Regulations (or the "Minor Source Program Regulations") herein attached as Exhibit A.
- D. The Minor Source Program Regulations establish a permitting program for minor sources of air pollution located on the Navajo Nation. Navajo EPA will implement this permitting program in the place of the current federal permitting program, which will allow the Navajo Nation to have greater control over its air resources and greater protection of the environment and public health and welfare.
- E. The Minor Source Program Regulations will require all minor sources of air pollution to obtain a "unitary" permit, which is a permit containing both preconstruction review and operating requirements related to air emissions. There are also permitting requirements for certain qualifying "modifications" to a new source or existing source of air pollution.
- F. The Minor Source Program Regulations also allow Navajo EPA to develop a "general permit", which is a permit that covers an entire category of activities. Sources that fall within the category would be covered by the general permit

- rather than a site-specific permit. Registration requirements were also created for those sources of air pollution that emit less emissions than a "minor source".
- G. The proposed Minor Source Program Regulations were posted for public comment in accordance with Navajo EPA's Uniform Regulations for Permit Review, Administrative Enforcement Orders, Hearings, and Rulemakings Under Navajo Nation Environmental Acts (the "Uniform Regulations"), Subpart 4.
- H. Two public comment periods were held for the proposed Minor Source Program Regulations; one comment period in 2018 and another in 2021. As part of the public comment efforts, public hearings were also held by Navajo EPA in 2018 and 2021.
- I. Two general permits (the General Permit for Gasoline Dispensing Facilities and the General Permit for Non-Major Sources and Minor Modifications to Non-Major Sources in the Oil and Gas Production and Natural Gas Processing Segments of the Oil and Natural Gas Sector) have already been developed by Navajo EPA, have gone out for public comment, and are herein attached for reference as **Exhibit B**.
- J. In accordance with Section 408(a) of the Uniform Regulations, Navajo EPA developed its "Response to Comments" in 2019 and 2021, which are herein attached as Exhibit C.
- K. The 164 Review Form (Document Number 016994) is attached as Exhibit D, including a review by the Navajo Nation Department of Justice deeming the Minor Source Program Regulations "legally sufficient".
- L. The Resources and Development Committee finds it in the best interest of the Navajo Nation to approve the Navajo Nation Clean Air Act Minor Source Program Regulations.

## SECTION THREE. APPROVAL

The Resources and Development Committee hereby approves the Navajo Nation Clean Air Act Minor Source Program Regulations herein attached as **Exhibit A**.
