TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACTION RELATING TO RESOURCES AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE; REAPPOINTING LORENZO MAX TO THE MANAGEMENT BOARD OF THE NAVAJO NATION HOSPITALITY ENTERPRISE

PURPOSE: The purpose of this legislation is to reappoint Mr. Lorenzo Max to the Navajo Nation Hospitality Enterprise's Management Board for a term of three (3) years.

Final Authority: Resources and Development Committee

Vote Required: Simple Majority

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committee. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review the proposed resolution in detail.

15	BE IT RESOLVED:	
16	SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY	
17	A. The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council	
18	has the authority to give final approval for appointments to the Navajo Nation	
19	enterprises. 2 N.N.C. § 501(B)(9).	
20	B. 5 N.N.C. § 1843(A) states: "The business and affairs of [the Navajo Nation	
21	Hospitality Enterprise] shall be managed by a five-person Board of Directors, the	
22	members of which shall meet the qualifications established in [the Navajo Nation	
23	Hospitality Enterprise's] plan of operation. The Board of Directors shall conduct its	
24	business in a similar manner as boards of directors of successful corporations in the	
25	hospitality business, to the extent feasible and permitted under [the Navajo Nation	
26	Hospitality Enterprise's] plan of operation and other applicable Navajo law.

28	SECTION TWO. FINDINGS	
29	A. The Navajo Nation Hospitality Enterprise (or "NNHE")'s Plan of Operation (the	
30	"Plan of Operation") was approved via Resolution CD-79-02. Article V(A) of the	

- Plan of Operation states that "[t]he Management Board shall consist of five (5) members appointed for staggered three-year terms by the President of the Navajo Nation with the concurrence of the Economic Development Committee [now, the Resources and Development Committee] of the Navajo Nation Council."
- B. Article V(B) of the Plan of Operation states that "Of the five (5) Board members appointed, one (1) member must be an experienced business person, one (1) member from the Government Services Committee [now the Naabik'íyáti Committee] of the Navajo Nation Council; one (1) from the Economic Development Committee [now the Resources and Development Committee] of the Navajo Nation Council; and two (2) members must have recognized expertise and substantial management experience in the motel-restaurant industry. No other employee of the federal or Navajo Nation government shall be a member of the Management Board. No Board member shall be an employee of the Enterprise."
- C. Each NNHE Board member shall serve a term of three (3) years. Plan of Operation Article V(A).
- D. Between 30 and 60 days prior to the expiration of any Board member's term, the President of the Navajo Nation is to appoint a qualified person to fill the expected Board member vacancy. Plan of Operation Article V(C).
- E. If the President of the Navajo Nation fails to nominate a qualified individual to fill the vacant Board position within 60 days, the Resources and Development Committee may nominate and confirm an appointment to the NNHE Management Board on its own initiative. Plan of Operation Article V(H).
- F. Pursuant to RDCO-37-20, Lorenzo Max was reappointed to the NNHE Management Board for a term of three years, which expired on October 13, 2023.
- G. On October 23, 2023, Lorenze Max sent a letter of interest about being reappointed to the NNHE Management Board and his resume to President Dr. Buu Nygren, which are attached as **Exhibit A**.
- H. On November 21, 2023, the NNHE Management Board passed Resolution No. 2023-4 supporting the reappointment of Lorenzo Max to the NNHE Management Board to serve in the capacity as the "Successful Navajo Business Person" on the Board. On

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February 21, 2024, NNHE Chief Executive Officer Stan Sapp sent a letter to President Nygren submitting NNHE Resolution No 2023-4 and Mr. Max's letter of interest and resume for President's Nygren's consideration. NNHE Resolution No. 2023-4 and the February 21, 2024 letter are herein attached as **Exhibit B**.

- I. President Nygren did not nominate a qualified individual to fill the vacant Board position within 60 days after being notified of the vacancy.
- J. Resources and Development Committee therefore finds it is in the best interest of the Navajo Nation to reappoint Lorenzo Max to the NNHE Management Board to serve as the "experienced Navajo business person".

SECTION THREE. APPROVAL

The Resources and Development Committee of the Navajo Nation Council hereby confirms the reappointment of Lorenzo Max to the Navajo Nation Hospitality Enterprise's Management Board for a term of three (3) years.
