TITLE OF RESOLUTION: AN ACTION RELATING TO NAVAJO NATION COUNCIL; CONFIRMING THE PERMANENT APPOINTMENT OF THE HONORABLE LETITIA STOVER AS NAVAJO NATION DISTRICT COURT JUDGE

**PURPOSE:** The purpose of this proposed resolution is to confirm the permanent appointment of the Honorable Letitia Stover as Navajo Nation District Court Judge.

Final Authority: Navajo Nation Council

Vote Required: Simple Majority

This written summary does not address recommended amendments as may be provided by the standing committees. The Office of Legislative Counsel requests each Council Delegate to review each proposed resolution in detail.

16	SECTION ONE. AUTHORITY	
17	A. The Navajo Nation established the Law and Order Committee (LOC) as a Navajo Nation	
18	standing committee and as such gave the Law and Order Committee authority to	
19	recommend to the Navajo Nation President the permanent appointment of probationary	
20	judges. 2 N.N.C. §§ 164 (A)(9), 600 (A), 601 (B)(10) (2012) see also CO-45-12.	
21	B. The Navajo Nation Council shall confirm judicial appointments. 7 N.N.C. § 355 (A) and	
22	(E) (2009).

24	SECTION TWO. FINDINGS	
25	A. On December 19, 2019, the Navajo Nation President appointed and the Navajo Nation	
26	Council confirmed Ms. Letitia Stover as a Navajo Nation probationary district court	
27	judge. See CD-48-19.	
28	B. "[A]ll District Court Judges shall be appointed for a probationary period of two years	
29	and upon permanent appointment shall serve thereafter during good behavior." 7 N.N.C.	
30	§ 355(B)	

- C. A probationary...Judge shall not be recommended for a permanent appointment unless he or she has successfully completed a course of training accredited for judges and he or she has received a satisfactory performance evaluation from the Chief Justice and the Law and Order (Judiciary) Committee of the Navajo Nation Council at the conclusion of the probationary...Judge's two-year probationary term. 7 N.N.C. § 355(C)
- D. On July 25, 2024, Chief Justice JoAnn Jayne provided a satisfactory performance evaluation and recommended Judge Letitia Stover for permanent appointment to District Court Judge of the Navajo Nation. See Exhibit "A".
- E. Judge Letitia Stover completed training courses from the National Judicial College for Fundamental Writing Skills for Judges, along with attending a host of local conferences on legal matters. See Exhibit "B."
- F. "At the conclusion of the two-year probationary term, the Law and Order (Judiciary)
  Committee shall review the record and qualifications of each probationary...Judge and shall recommend to the President whether or not each probationary...Judge has satisfactorily completed the probationary term and should be appointed to a permanent position. The President shall not appoint to a permanent position any probationary...Judge not recommended by the Law and Order (Judiciary) Committee.

  The appointments shall be submitted to the Navajo Nation Council for confirmation." 7 N.N.C. § 355(E)
- G. Due to delays caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, Judge Letitia Stover's public hearing and probation evaluations were delayed. In 2023, the Navajo Nation reopened after the COVID-19 crises and the Navajo Nation government implemented measures to resume in person functions. Included in the reopening measures was prioritizing evaluations for the judges.
- H. On October 14, 2024, the Law and Order Committee determined Judge Letitia Stover met the qualifications for appointment as a permanent Navajo Nation District Court Judge and forwarded her name to the Navajo Nation President for judicial appointment consideration. See LOCO-05-24.

- I. On December 13, 2024, the Navajo Nation President recommended to the Navajo Nation Council the permanent appointment of Ms. Letitia Stover as a District Court Judge. Exhibit "C."
- J. The Navajo Nation finds it in the best interest of the Navajo Nation Judicial Branch that Judge Letitia Stover is confirmed for permanent status as a Navajo Nation District Court Judge.

#### SECTION THREE. CONFIRMATION AS PERMANENT JUDGE

The Navajo Nation confirms Ms. Letitia Stover as a permanent Navajo Nation District Court Judge.

#### SECTION FOUR: RECOMMENDATION FOR ADDITIONAL STEP INCREASE

- A. The Law and Order Committee recommends that Judge Letitia Stover be provided an additional salary step increase, in addition to the two-step increase provided after confirmation as provided in Resolution No. LOCO-08-14, "Amending the Navajo Nation Justices and Judges Salary Schedule."
- B. The Law and Order Committee recognizes that Judge Letitia Stover was eligible to be evaluated and considered for permanent appointment once she fulfilled her two year probationary period. However, due to delays from the COVID-19 pandemic, Judge Letitia Stover's public hearing and probationary evaluations were delayed.
- C. In evaluating Navajo Nation Justices and Judges for possible step increases, Judge Letitia Stover could not be considered for an additional step increase in 2023, due to her probationary status.
- D. Therefore, the Law and Order Committee recommends that the additional step increase be provided for Judge Letitia Stover.

### SECTION FIVE. NAVAJO NATION PRIVACY ACT

Confidential information within application documents shall remain protected except upon its authorized disclosure by the appointee. 2 N.N.C. § 81 et seq. (2009).
